Competencies and Skills to cope with Diversity and Professionalization: Pointers from some recent discussions

Abstract:

The debates on new international education and development agendas frequently ask: What are the 21st century skills? What are the skills for the future? Can we even generate skills through education and learning to anticipate the future? When in this contribution we use the word skills then we mean it in the very broad and inclusive way: It includes knowledge, competencies, capacities, qualifications, and in an additional dimension attitudes and values also. We have chosen two important areas for our presentation: We identify diversity issues in respect to migration, integration, and inclusion, and related youth and adult education.
