The longstanding myth of lifelong job collapsed and the idea of lifelong learning emerged.


■ 2nd Economic Crisis in 2008

The student enrollment at KNOU was not affected.

The student enrollments of the open and cyber universities amount up to 20% of traditional universities.







March 2008: Reorganizing the government

Ministry of Education, Science and Technology launched (two ministries merged)

'Lifelong and Vocational Education Bureau' survived (one of 15 bureaus)

May 2009: Reorganizing the ministry

70 divisions reduced into 60

'e-Learning Support Division' survived





What Technology Can Do

New Tutoring Model at KNOU

- Internet-Based Tutoring
- Department-Based Tutoring
- Tutoring Supported by Blended Learning
- Group Tutoring





- Each tutor operating his own homepage
- Each tutor being in charge of around 150 students
- Group tutoring: an inevitable choice, but having its own merits which small group tutoring may not aim at



Learners sharing knowledge

Through the tutoring site, students share with other tutees their own learning tips, summaries of lectures, and study materials. They also exchange questions and answers with other tutees. In a sense they become teachers. They like it. In short their knowledge and information are shared within the tutoring group. A kind of learning community is formed within the site.





Students motivation activated

The peer tutees in the group serve not only as good helpers but also as good-willed competitors. The students' motivation for learning is activated by the peer tutees in the group. The adult learners feel as if they were young pupils again, thus they try to be a good boy or girl and to be a best student.





Students enjoying companionship

Studying at a distance university drives adult learners into hardships. They feel consoled and comforted when they meet their companions. They feel as if they were not alone in the long and lonely journey. This sense of companionship is a merit the students hardly expect in the individual or small group tutoring.





■ The sense of get-togetherness: a characteristic Asian sentiment

Asian people are believed to feel more contented and secured when they belong to a group or a larger unit. We find the traditional 'we—feeling' more alive in Asian society than in other countries. Group tutoring touches this happy and important psychology inherent in Asian people. Group tutoring is a happy marriage of technology and psychology.

















In Feb 2006, / projects set up by KNOU

Operation Strategy


 Collecting <u>recommended publications from professionals</u> of e-learning and lifelong learning and providing their comments on the publications

- 15 reports and web sites


















Objective

Operation Strategies


- Collecting each country's e-learning courses (certificate and degree) and providing the information on the e-ASEM web site
- Translating parts of two courses of Dept. of e-learning at KNOU and posting them on the e-ASEM web site


Outcomes







Whitepaper will be published and presented at the ASEM conference in the future






