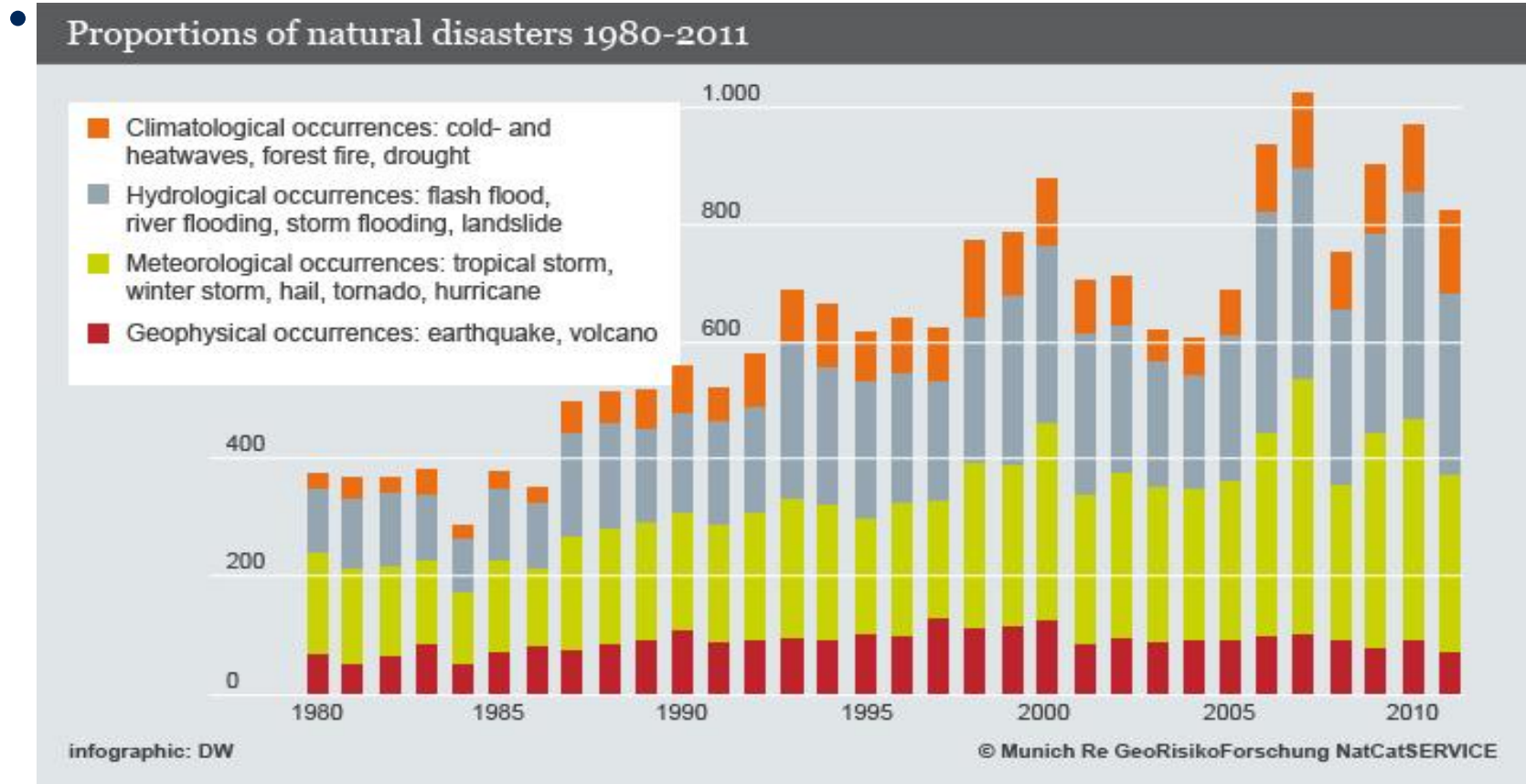

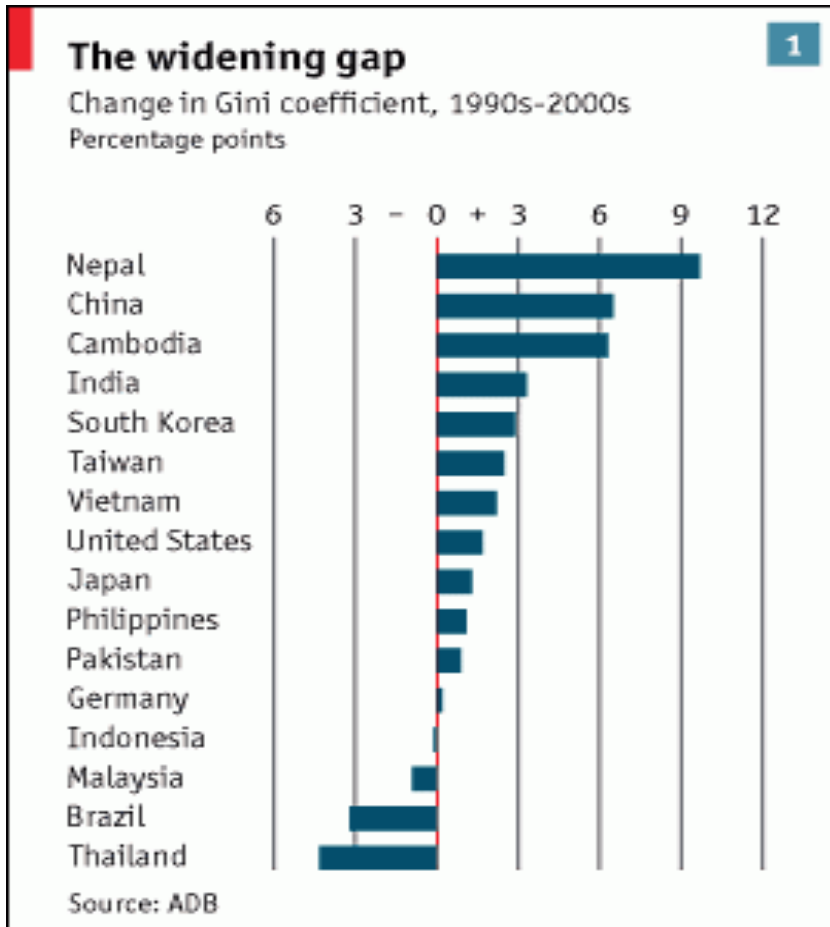
If Human lives come first, we should not forget:

Large shifts in the GINI coefficient



Countries in Asia Pacific have seen widening income disparities.

Income inequality is a problem that many developed countries face as well.

Shouldn't we educate the rich?

Illiteracy prevails

Still around **781**
million illiterate adults

(**498** million in Asia and Pacific)

Women represent **2/3** of illiterate
adults (64% in South and West Asia)
